

JOHN F. BROWN

John was raised in the small west Texas town of Floydada (about 50 miles northeast of Lubbock,) on a farm raising cotton and wheat. He attended the University of Wisconsin on a boxing scholarship. After earning a BS degree in Mechanical Engineering, John reined in Madison for three years selling cars full time. He pumped gas 11:00 PM to 7:00 AM six nights a week for three years while he went to school and owned and managed three service stations while selling cars.

In 1968 his Army reserve unit was activated and he served 11/2 years including

10 months in Vietnam and he was awarded the Bronze Star. After "Nam" he entered graduate school at Texas Tech University. He completed his MBA in 1970 and went to work for Continental Oil Company in Houston in January, 1971.

John spent four years with Conoco working in numerous capacities: engineer, Special Project Development; plant engineer of a natural gas/gasoline plant in Eagan Louisiana; plant foreman of the Grand Chenniere gas plant on the coast of Louisiana; staff engineer in Houston; Buyer in charge of Purchasing Department in Lake Charles, Louisiana, and Senior Buyer in charge of purchasing for the refinery/chemical plants in Louisiana. During his work in the Special Projects division, he worked under Archie Dunham, President of Continental Oil Company.



While on special assignment for Conoco in October of 1974, John met a gentleman on an airplane who owned a company in Montana selling farm buildings on a private label basis. Six months later he made John an offer he couldn't refuse, and John left Conoco to go to work in Billings, Montana as a Vice President of purchasing, finance and manufacturing. One of his first assignments was to locate and purchase a factory so the company could manufacture and sell its own products, rather than selling on a private label basis.

John resigned from this company in February, 1976 to found Tri-Steel Structures. Tri-Steel sold farm buildings on private label basis through an initial eight-state territory. Sales exceeded \$1,000,000 the first year working out of the basement in John's home. In 1977 Tri-Steel introduced and sold its first steel framed home and it quickly became apparent that the future of Tri-Steel was in steel homes, not metal buildings. In 1980 the steel home portion of the business had expanded substantially and the company relocated to Denton, Texas (30 miles north of Dallas) with an emphasis on developing and selling steel framed homes.
